Mildred "Millie" (Murton) Teuscher graduated from Collinwood High School in 1951. She worked at Mentor City Hall for six years in the Planning Department, and was the recording secretary for the Planning Commission. Millie was a councilwoman in Mentor nearly ten years.

In 1988, Millie was the first woman ever elected a Lake County Commissioner, and served in that capacity for 14 years. As commissioner, Millie was responsible for allocating the county's monies to the proper departments and organizations such as Deepwood and others; she was responsible for the Mentor Civic Center and the city's pool. She also served on the Lake County Narcotics Board. Millie was chairperson for the Board of Commissioners for 3 years.

Millie's involvement in the community has been extensive. She has been a volunteer for the March of Dimes, Heart Fund, and the Muscular Dystrophy Association. Millie has served on the Mentor City Zoning Board of Appeals. Millie was also involved with the Lake County Kidney Foundation, Lake Hospital Systems, and the Visitor's Bureau, as Vice President (12 years). She was a member of the United Way Lake County Needs Assessment Committee, the Mentor Rotary Club, and the Collinwood Alumni Association. She was involved with the Lake County Family and Children First initiative.
