Domenic Scricca graduated from Collinwood High School in January 1949. He received his B.S. Degree from Kent State University.

After serving in the U.S. Army, Domenic wasn't sure what he wanted to do with his life. He decided to go into business, and he became the owner and operator of University Business and Supply Company that serviced office equipment and designed and installed in-plant offices.

In 1982 he became chairman of the Ashtabula County Development Association. In 1983 he was appointed by Congressman Dennis E. Eckart to the 11th Congressional District Advisory Board on Housing Development and Economic Opportunity for Ashtabula County.

In 1984 he decided to try his hand at politics and was elected to the City Council. In 1987 he was elected as City Manager of Ashtabula, a city of 30,000 citizens.

In 1990 he became Executive Director of the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for Ashtabula County. His duties included maintaining 1,300 housing units. He was instrumental in building a new administration building.

Domenic has received many awards and honors for his many years of service in the public sector of Ashtabula County.
