Dr. Ernest Mazzaferri graduated from CHS in June of 1954. While a student at Collinwood he was president of the Student Council, active in Honor Study Hall and a member of the Centaur's Club. It seems that even then Ernest has aspirations of becoming a doctor. His yearbook lists him as, ". . . most likely to become a Flea Surgeon."

After graduation he attended John Carroll University and graduated cum laude with a Bachelors of Science degree in Biology in 1958. Ernest entered Medical School at Ohio State University, and graduated in 1962. Ever since that time Dr. Mazzaferri has been an academic physician and is presently Professor of internal Medicine and Physiology and Chairman of the Department of Internal Medicine

at Ohio State.

Internationally known for his work in the treatment of thyroid cancer, Dr. Mazzaferri has written several books and is the author of Endocrinology Base Studies. He is the editor of Textbook of Endocrinology, Advances in Endocrinology and Metabolism, and Endocrine Tumors. He has authored or coauthored over 200 medical scientific papers and abstracts, appearing in such journals as the "New England Journal of Medicine", "American Journal of Medicine" and the "Journal of the American Medical Association."

Dr. Mazzaferri is a Master of the American College of Physicians and is a member of numerous professional societies including the American Thyroid Association, the Endocrine Society, the Central Society for Clinical Research, the American Federation for Clinical Research, the Association of Professors of Medicine, and the American Clinical and Climatological Association. He is a member of the subspecialty board of the American Board of Internal Medicine, is listed in Who's Who in America, and the Best Doctors in America.

Throughout the years and in spite of a tremendous schedule of lecturing and publishing, Dr. Mazzaferri has continued to see patients; they are the fuel that feeds him - they are his greatest source of satisfaction.

Ernest is married to Florence; they have four children, Patricia, Michael, Sharon and Ernest.
