Mrs. Taub graduated from our high school in 1943. She then attended Kent State University and received both her B.S. and M.Ed. degrees.

Evelyn has been teaching in Euclid City Schools for twenty-five years. She has taught Kindergarten, First Grade, Second Grade, Fifth Grade, Sixth Grade and Reading Recovery. She is currently teaching Heading Lab, a Title I program at Upson School. Evelyn was named as the "Celebrate Literacy" Award recipient for the Euclid Council of the International Reading Association for 2000. This award is presented annually to acknowledge outstanding contributions in teaching reading and promoting literacy including publishing and volunteerism. She has impressed her colleagues with her dedication. The Euclid Teachers Association in 1999 also selected her as an "Outstanding Educator".

Evelyn is the author of the book *Are You The New Principal?* The book was published by Dominie Press which is known for publishing early literacy books and Reading Recovery books. She has donated royalties from this book to support various early literacy projects. She received recognition from Dominie Press for writing *Are You The New Principal?* at the Reading Recovery Conferences in Columbus, Ohio and Los Angeles, California.

She has been the recipient of the Martha Holden Jennings Foundation Grant, The Henry P, Kathryn A Kurdziel Foundation Grant and Cleveland State University grants for the benefit of her school. The Cleveland State University grants were awarded for the need for continued language development, exposure to animals living in other areas in our country, and for greater exposure to "Great Moments In History" such as the building of the pyramids and railroads, Alaska, its natives and igloos; and a jig saw puzzle of the United States. The students were eager to work with these materials.
