Ms. Mell graduated from Collinwood in 1971. While a student she was in the Honors Program, belonged to the National Honor Society, the "Top Twenty", City-Wide Student Council and the Higbee (now Dillards) Teen Board. She was News Editor of the Spotlight, and received the French Award from the University of Georgia Language Program for high school students and the Ohio University Journalism Scholarship for high school students.

In her letter of acceptance for the Hall of Fame she wrote, "All I have accomplished since that time (graduation) was nurtured by the education I received there."

Pat received her B.A. Degree from Wellesley College where she graduated with honors. Her Juris Doctorate degree was awarded by Case Western Reserve University.
