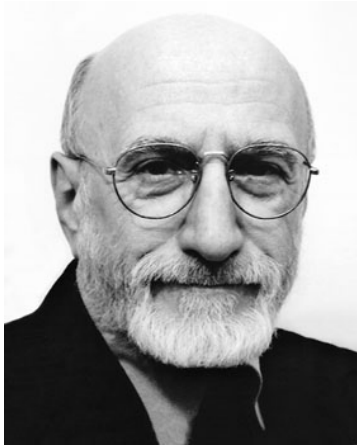


Primo Del Calzo, Ph.D.

Primo V. Del Calzo, PhD graduated from Collinwood High School in January of 1952. While at Collinwood he received a Merit Award, the Collinwood High School Distinctive Service and Leadership Award and was membership in the National Honor Society. He was elected to Buckeye Boys State, and was a recipient of the Gold Honor Key, and was president of the Student Council.

He attended Cleveland College of Western Reserve University and earned a Bachelor of Science Degree in speech pathology and a minor in psychology.

In 1967 he received his Master of Arts Degree in the field of speech and language pathology. In 1973 Primo received his doctorate from Case Western University, specializing in communicative disorders.

Primo was a speech-language therapist in the Willoughby-Eastlake and Mayfield City Schools for eight years. After receiving his doctorate, Primo served as a consultant to a number of school systems and boards of mental retardation in the Greater Cleveland Area.

He developed a speech, language, and hearing program for the East Cleveland Public Schools.

He began his teaching career at Case Western University teaching at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. In 1973 he was appointed to the Speech and Hearing Department staff at Cleveland State University, where he taught classes at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

In 1974 he was asked to redesign and head the Graduate Program for Public School Practicum in Speech and Hearing along with the Ohio Department of Education. Primo became the director of the Speech-Language Clinic at Cleveland State University, which treats a broad range of people with communicative disabilities.

Primo made many professional presentations and did much community service on behalf of people with communicative disorders.
